



For any child attending any school in the state of Georgia for the first time, a parent or guardian must submit a valid certificate of immunization. A certificate for a child who is in the process of receiving all required vaccines must have a date of expiration that relates to the date the next required immunization is due or the date on which a medical exemption must be reviewed. A new certificate must then be obtained and submitted to the school or facility within 30 days after the expiration date. Children whose parents fail to renew said certificates within the time allotted shall not be permitted to continue in attendance.

**Effective July 1, 2007 for entrance into kindergarten and for new entrants into a Georgia School, students must have a total of two (2) doses of *measles* vaccine, two (2) doses of *mumps* vaccine, one (1) dose of *rubella* vaccine.

** Effective July 1, 2007 for entrance into kindergarten and for new entrants into a Georgia School, students must have a total of two (2) doses *varicella* (chickenpox) vaccine.

**Effective July 1, 2007 for entrance into kindergarten and for new entrants into a Georgia School, children born on or after January 1, 2006 must have proof of protection against *hepatitis A* disease (vaccination or serology).

Contact your health care professional to receive any needed vaccinations and to obtain a new Certificate of Immunization (Form 3231) PRIOR to the FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL. Photocopies are accepted.
