Millage Rate Types:

- Maintenance & Operations (M&O)
- Bond

Bond Millage Rate:

- In 2011, school bond millage rate eliminated.
- Debt Service (principal and interest) shifted from property tax millage to sales tax.
- Removed tax burden from property owners, shifted to purchasers of certain goods and services in Paulding County (resident or not).
- A bond millage of approximately 1.700 would be required to meet FY2024 debt service.

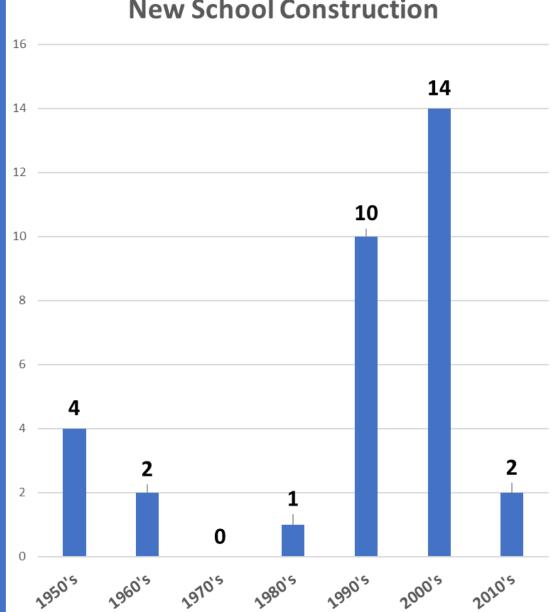

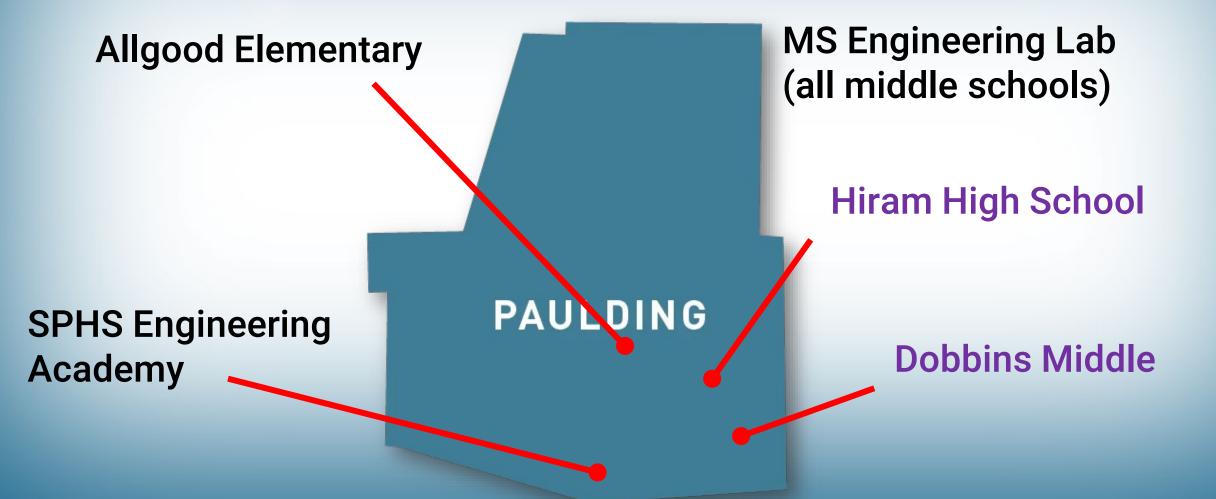

Building Condition Study

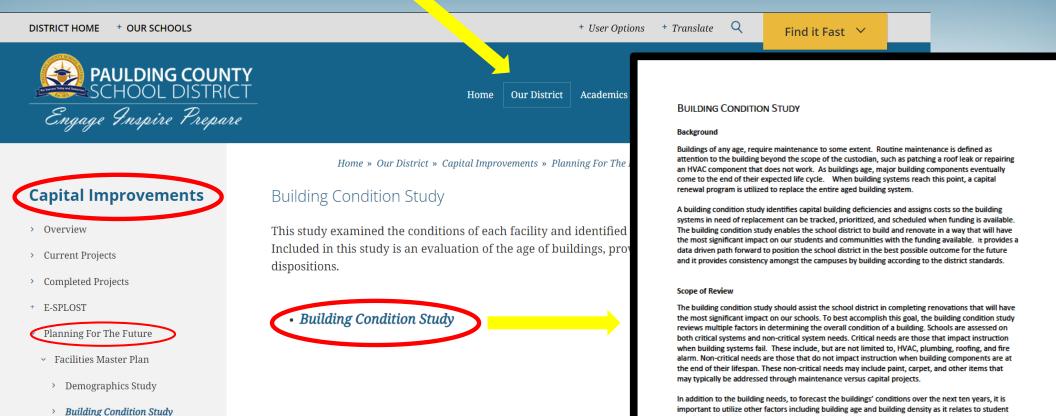
- Helps track individual needs at each facility.
- Each facility is evaluated using the same criteria and then scored.
- Accounts for building components with lifecycles that will expire in the future.
- Considers buildings with additions of varying ages.

Ed Specs & Design Standards

- All district-funded building components comply with district standards.
- Necessary to maintain consistency.

important to utilize other factors including building age and building density as it relates to student enrollment. It is reasonable to predict that facilities will require more attention as they become older. Additionally, schools that have greater student density will naturally exhibit more wear and tear. By scoring and weighting these factors at each facility, the district can identify schools and future renovations according to their scores on both critical and non-critical needs. Below is the scoring scale and building classifications used in the building condition study.

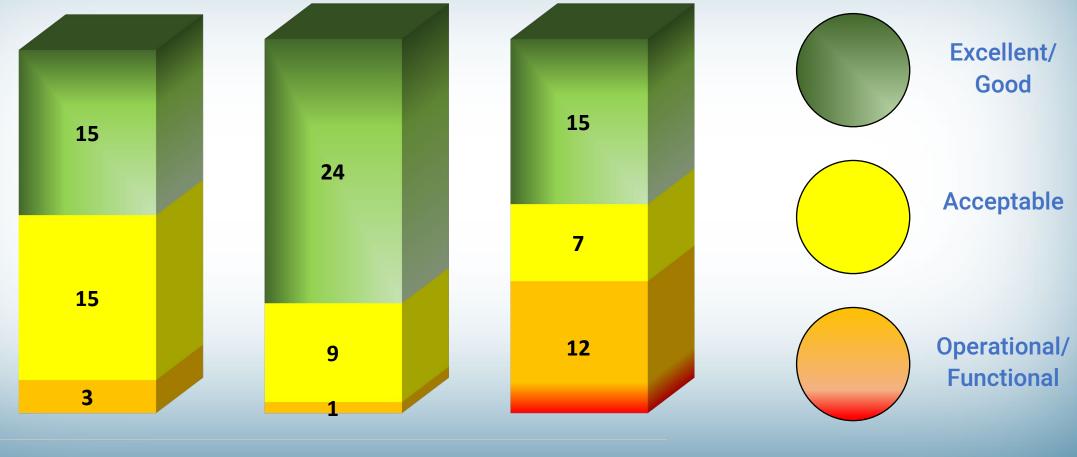

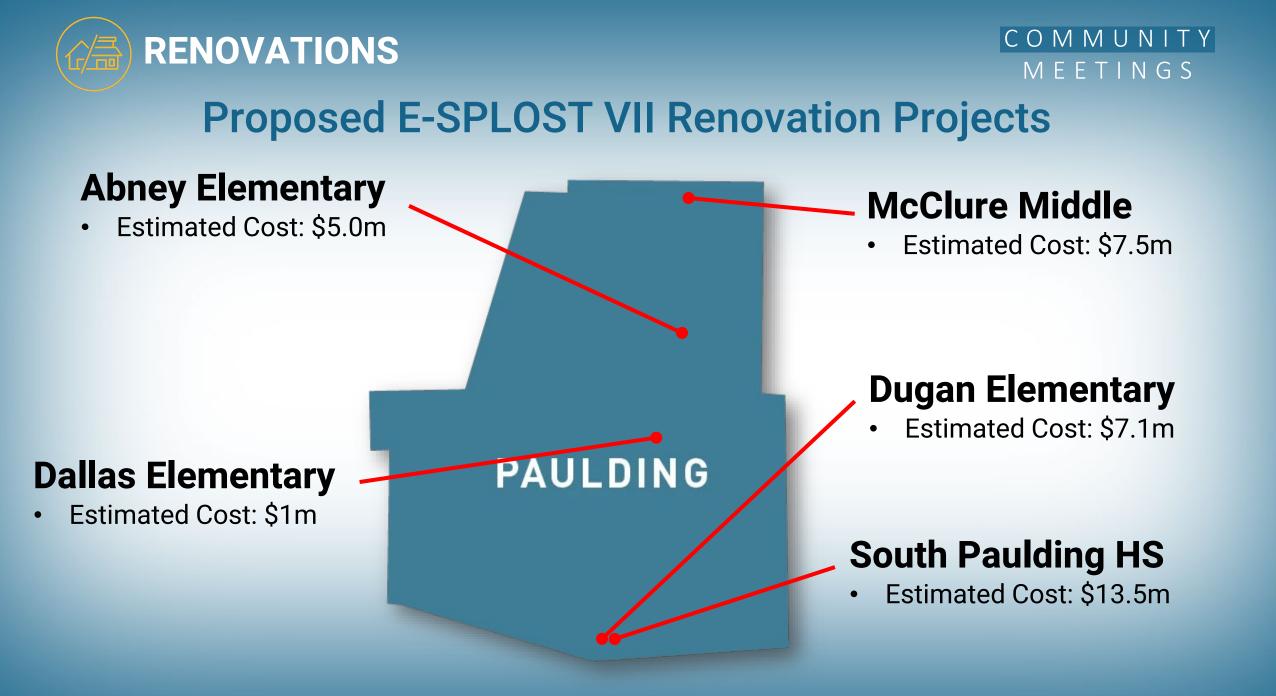
FY33 FORECAST – NO E-SPLOST VII

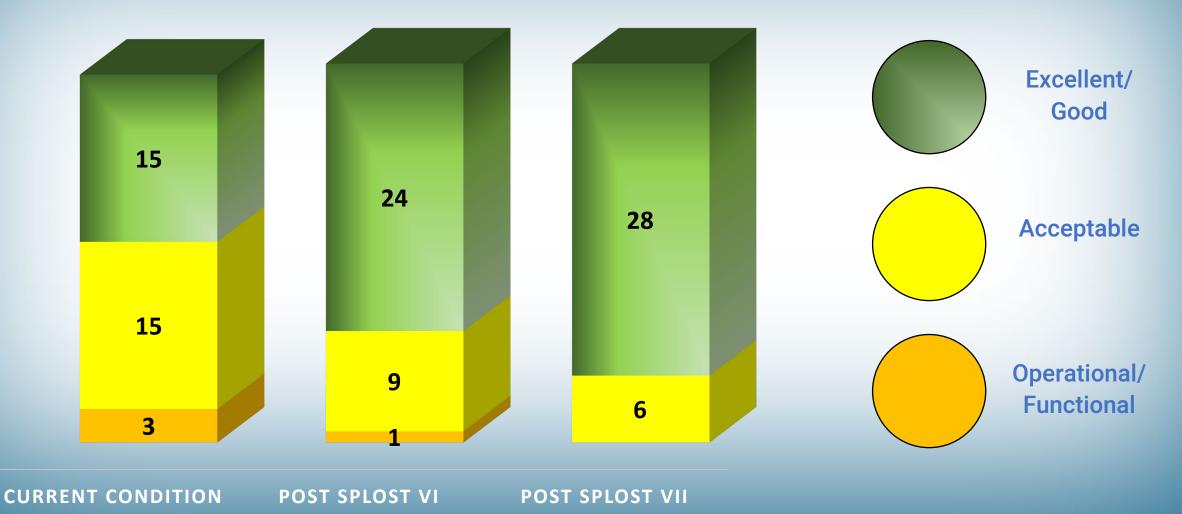

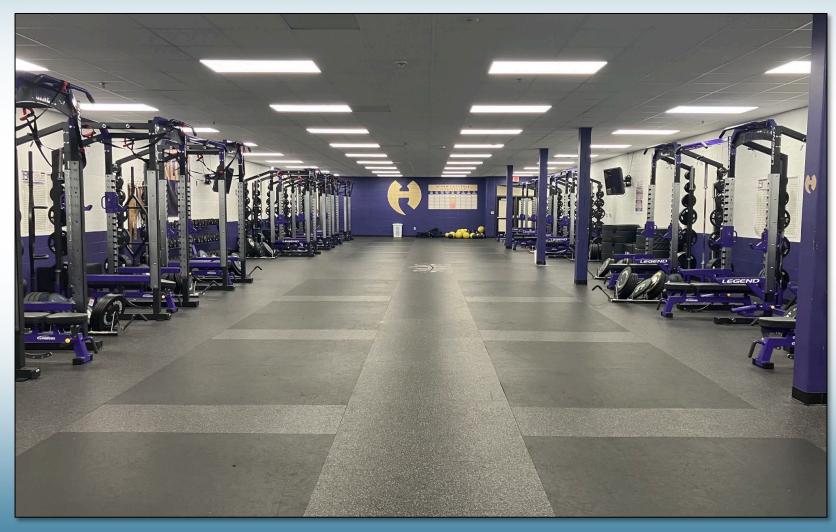

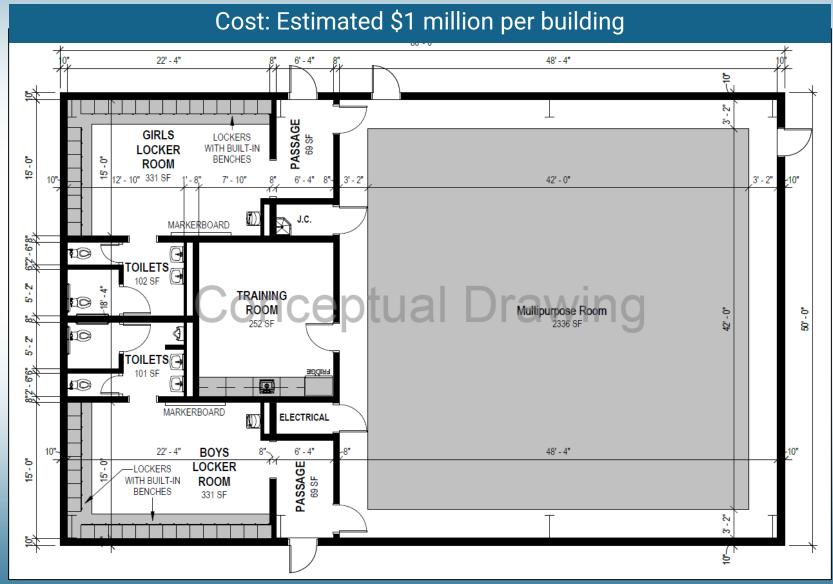

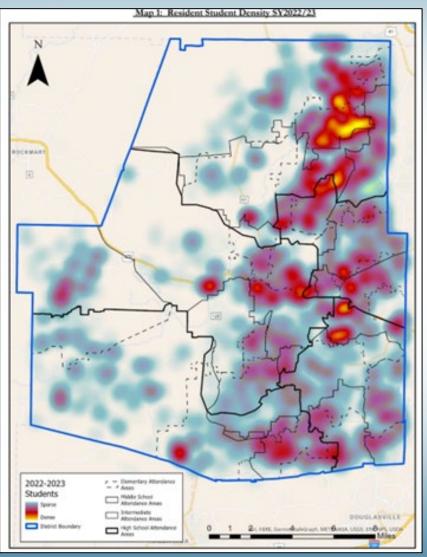

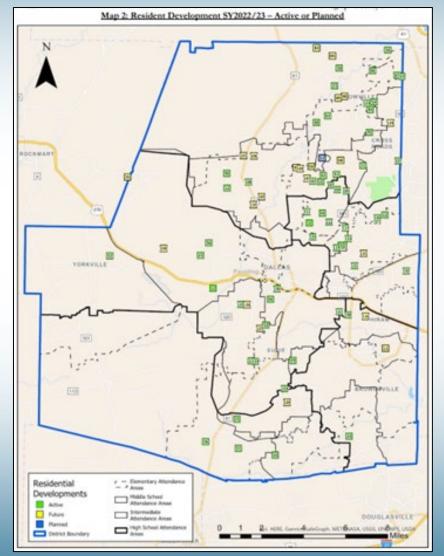




Student Density 2022-2023

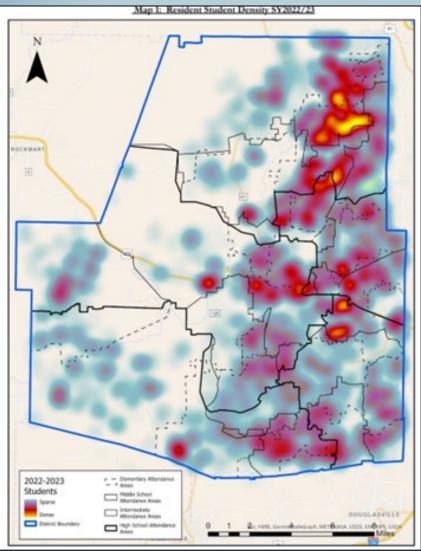


Residential Development 2022-2023



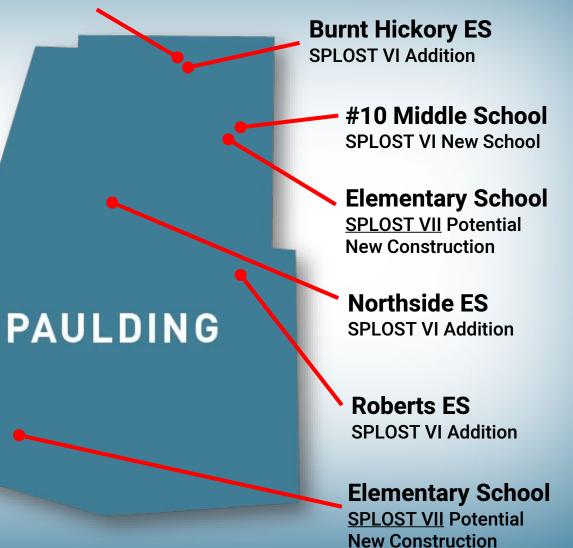

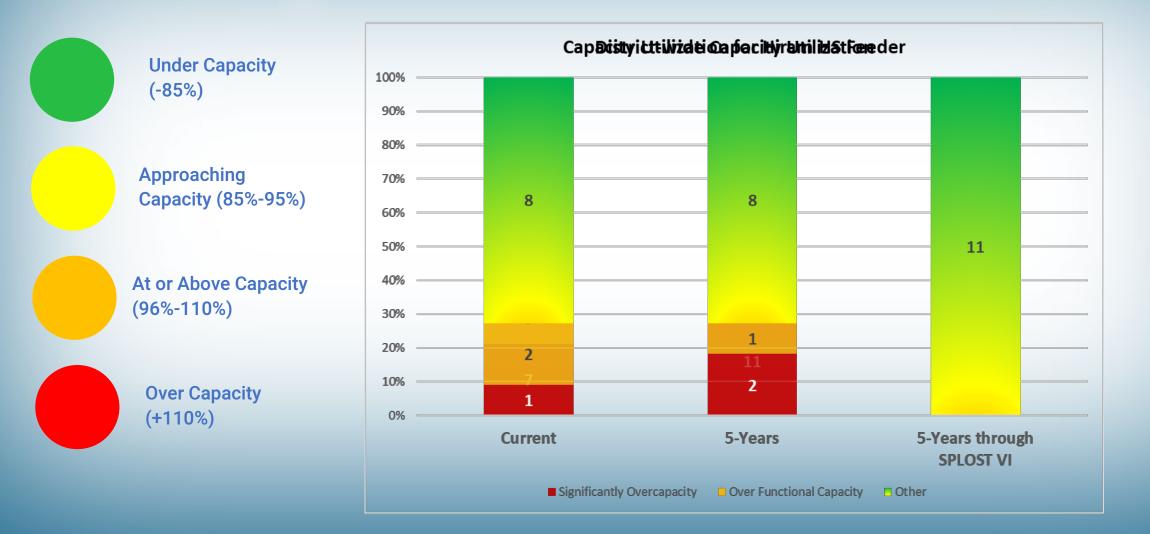

Capacity Utilization through E-SPLOST VI

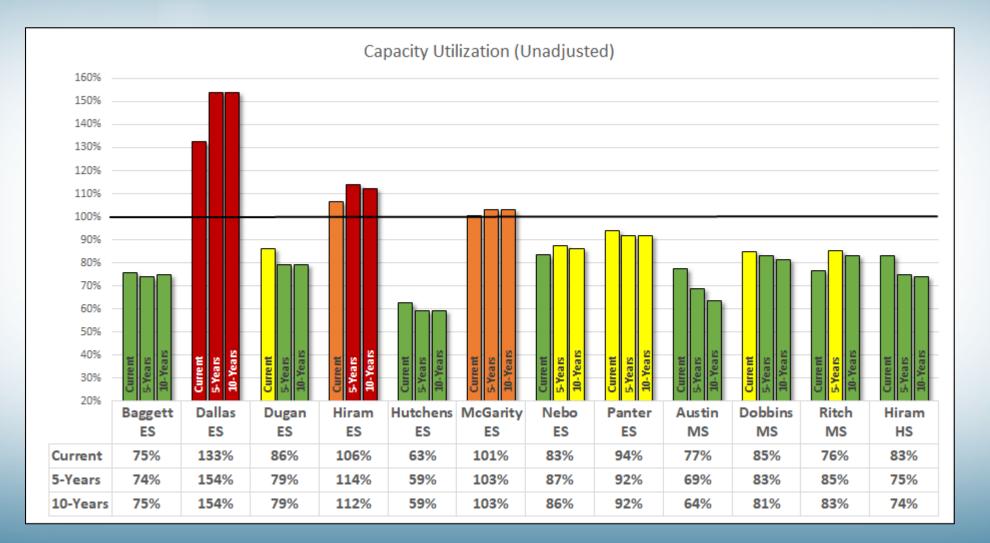

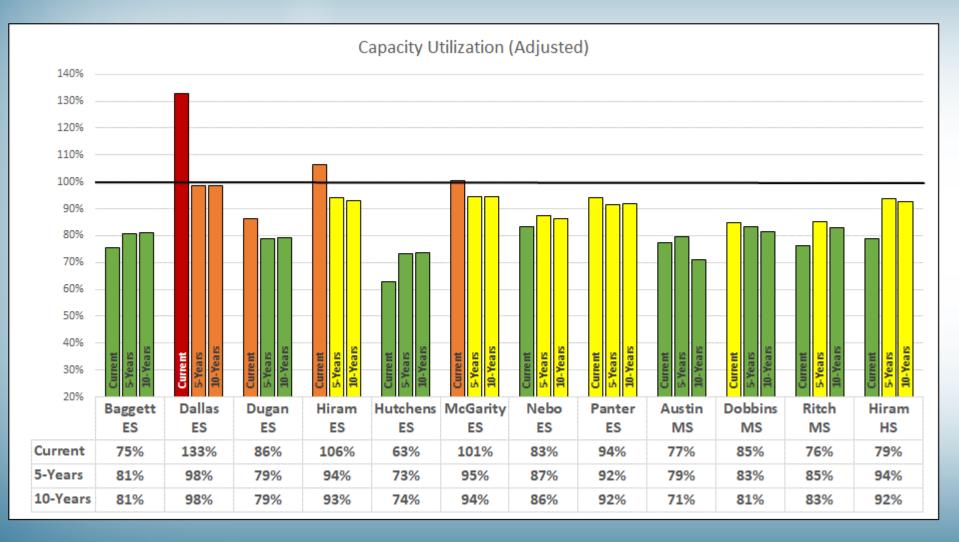

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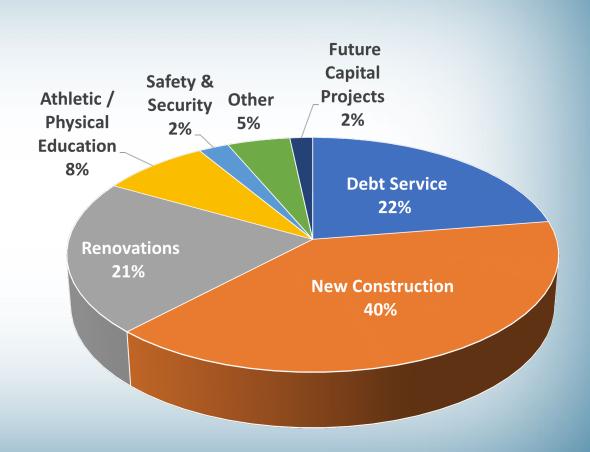

What is E-SPLOST (Education Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax)?

- One-cent sales tax on all eligible retail sales in Paulding County.
- Not a new tax, but a continuation of the current E-SPLOST program.
- It is a consumption tax, not a property tax.
- Everyone who makes a purchase contributes to our schools.
- Cannot be used for operating expenses.
- We can educate but we cannot advocate for SPLOST.

As we build new schools and facilities, or renovate existing schools and facilities, the Paulding County School District Capital Program is committed to the belief that student success is best achieved in a future-focused, supportive, and safe learning environment. To that end, our plan provides for fiscal responsibility, informed and coordinated goals for long-term needs in growth, while also continually enhancing the current facilities through these key program areas:

- Forecasting future enrollment and classroom capacity needs
- Designing facilities to meet program needs of students
- Using comprehensive educational and design specifications to analyze building needs
- · Prioritizing projects based on Master Facility Plan and Georgia Department of Education Local Facilities Plan
- Managing scope, schedule, and budget within the context of capital cash flow

Capital Projects, whether new builds or renovations and modifications, are completed in collaboration with key internal and external stakeholders. This communication ensures that the project and program meets community, local, and state standards and service.

The process of capital construction is completed in four key phases:



While there may not be an active project at every school and facility, every school and facility is included in the plan. This site is designed to ensure that all schools are informed of school-based projects and to inform our community of sound capital fund management from State Capital Outlay awards to E-SPLOST and bonds.

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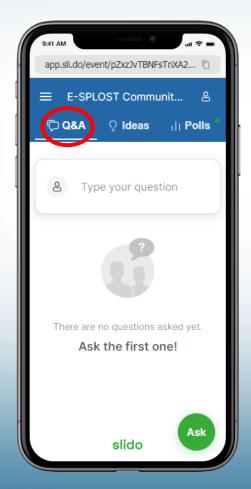




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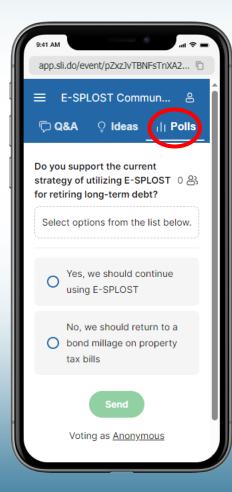
