NPHS Parking Rules & Guidelines 2024-2025

In consideration for the privilege of driving and parking a motor vehicle on the campus of North Paulding High School, the student and parent hereby acknowledge and agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the Paulding County School District stated in the Parking Permit Application and Vehicle Registration form and the rules and regulations of North Paulding High School stated below.

1. All students desiring to drive a vehicle to school must lease a parking permit for each vehicle that will be driven and parked. The student must show a valid insurance card, registration, and driver's license upon application for the permit. Students must follow all instructions for submitting applications.
2. Permits are leased to individual students and vehicles; permits may not be sub-leased or given to other students to use. If a student no longer needs or desires their leased parking space, he or she may return the permit to the school for a pro-rated refund.
3. The parking permit must be displayed appropriately. This means the number and pass can easily be observed from outside of the vehicle.
4. The priority for purchasing permits will be as outlined on the parking website.
5. The driver/owner of any vehicle will be responsible for the use of the vehicle while on campus and subsequently for any violation of any rules or regulations (shown below).
6. Vehicle owners agree to maintain adequate liability insurance and current registration.
7. Paulding County Board of Education shall not be responsible for any losses or damage to the property of users of its facilities, including loss due to bodily injury.
8. A student parking on campus whose vehicle does not have a valid parking permit risks having the vehicle towed away at the owner's expense.
 - a. Cars will be towed by Moore's Towing (770/443-0692); all fees will be paid directly to this company.
9. Revocation of parking privileges may range from at least one day to the rest of the school year. Serious offenses could result in permanent revocation. The length of revocation shall be at the discretion of the principal or his or her designee.
10. Students whose parking privileges have been revoked into the subsequent semester or school year will be eligible to purchase a parking permit and regain the privilege of driving and parking on campus at the conclusion of the period of revocation IF student parking spaces are available at that time.
11. Students whose parking privileges have been suspended or revoked will not be allowed to use daily/emergency parking.
12. Refunds will not be issued to students who have had their parking privileges suspended or revoked.
13. Students enrolled in Work Based Learning/Dual Enrollment programs MUST meet the parking rules and regulations as stated. No exceptions will be made, nor special privileges extended, to ~~students~~

enrolled in any of these programs. This includes if a driver loses parking privileges; he/she will need to find a ride to and from school. If one cannot be found, open periods can be spent in ISS.

14. It shall be the student's responsibility to keep track of the number of absences, tardies, and early dismissals he/she has accumulated. There shall be no warnings given prior to a student exceeding the number allowed.
15. Vehicles are not permitted to display any flag, banner, sticker, decal or message, which may be determined by school officials as being offensive or deemed disruptive to the safe and orderly operation of the school. This rule applies while the vehicle is being driven onto or off campus or while parked on campus. It also applies if the vehicle is being used to represent the school on an off-campus activity.
16. Students are responsible for any contraband in their vehicle. All vehicles parked on campus are subject to search.
17. Athletes must maintain their vehicles in their assigned parking spot for the day, including during afternoon sports practices and activities unless directed to move by the principal or his designee

Warning communicated to student	Loss of driving privileges for an academic week or equivalent of 5 days	Loss of driving privileges for two academic weeks or equivalent of 10 days	Loss of driving privileges for the remainder of the semester (minimum of 20 days)

*****Any student driver who leaves school property OR takes another student off campus without permission will immediately lose parking privileges for the remainder of the semester and possibly be denied those privileges permanently.***

*****WBL/DE/Minimum Day students who violate the NPHS Parking Offenses as listed above may receive a consequence of ISS and/or revocation of his/her Parking Lot Pass.***

After reading and understanding the rules and regulations as stated above, the undersigned acknowledges that permission to drive and/or park a vehicle on campus is a privilege and not a right. I have read, understand, and agree to abide by the rules and regulations specified in the North Paulding High School Parking Contract.
