## **Demographics**

Nebo Elementary serves approximately 860 students in grades Pre-K–5. Our student population is diverse, representing the following racial demographics: 13% Hispanic/Latino, 22% Black/African, 56% White, .002% Asian, and 8% identifying as two or more races.

Approximately 59% of students are eligible for free or reduced-priced lunch, indicating a significant percentage of low-income families. 18% of the student body receives Special Education services and .002% are classified as English Language Learners (ELL).
