Readina

We will continue to read <u>Lulu and</u> the <u>Brontosaurus</u>. After each chapter, we will discuss main idea, characters and settings. We will also compare the main character Lulu to other characters we have recently read about. Students will continue to write in their journals about what the main idea of each chapter is.

We will continue to work on retelling the story as well as book elements; such as, setting, character, and events.

Math

We will continue to review previously learned standards as we also begin explore new standards. One important standard is identifying tens and ones in a number. We will use tens rods and ones cubes to represent and model tens and ones. Students will need to be able to draw tens rods and cubes to show tens and ones in a number. This study will help students to understand adding and subtracting double digit numbers as we use these models to show grouping of ones to make a ten unit.

We will continue working with comparing numbers and using the greater than (>), less than (<) and equal to (=) symbols.

MD1: Orders and compares length MD2: Measures length MD3: Tells time (to the hour) MD4: Represents and interprets data.

School - to -Home Connection

Reading: We have learned about the difference of simple and compound sentences (using a conjunction to combine two sentences). While reading have your child pick out when they notice the two types of sentences. Have him identify which conjunction was used in a compound sentence.

Math: Give your student a few random double digit numbers and have them draw tens rods and ones' cubes to represent the number. They could also use crayons or pencils to represent the tens and another smaller object to represent the ones.

<u>Phonics:</u> Look for combinations in words while reading. Common words will use *ar*, *or*, *er*, *ur* and *ir*. Point out *qu* words. Ex.-bird, short, arm, turn.

We will begin assessing using dictated sentences as well as students making up their own sentences using these words. This week's spelling patterns will be: Words with Ing, ed and s endings, oo, long vowel/sneaky e.
